



With the witness of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr to guide us, your WPC Local Missions Committee declares the month of January a time to highlight the spiritual discipline of service. This month we're offering exciting opportunities we hope will stretch your imagination about service and call you to continued faithfulness. Here's how you can participate in our Month of Service at WPC:

MLK Day (January 16) Morning of Mission Sign up to come to the church from 9:00am - 1:00pm to be part of several neighborhood teams that will serve our town. Lunch will be included! Look for more information and sign up soon.

Housing for New Hope Point in Time Count of the Homeless in Durham County Once per year, Durham County seeks to count the number of persons experiencing homelessness in our community. You can help with any of three teams: 1. The Count Team, which goes out on Jan 25, 7:30-11:30 p.m., to canvas and conduct interviews with unsheltered people. 2. The Goodie bag Team prepares snack bags for those unsheltered and volunteers who work on Jan 25. These are



due to HNH by Jan 20. 3. The Service Based Count Team will check in with persons who access community services in the days after the count to confirm whether they were housed or unsheltered on the night of Jan 25.
