



Ordering Details & Info

- Pay ahead for one, two, or all three months so that Changhe Zhou can plant enough vegetables for our boxes and care for the plants through all kinds of weather situations.
- Dates for Winter 2024:
 - January (4 weeks): 7, 14, 21, 28
 - February (4 weeks): 4, 11, 18, 25
 - o March (4 weeks): 3, 10, 17, 24
 - Cost:
 - Small Share Size \$25/week 8 varieties (fewer items) \$100/month; pay \$200 for 2 months or \$300 for 3 months
 - Regular Share Size \$35/week 8 varieties \$140/month; pay \$280 for 2 months or \$420 for 3 months
 - Large Share Size \$45/week 11 varieties \$180/month; pay \$360 for 2 months or \$540 for 3 months

 - If you share a box between two families, then one person subscribes and prepays for both, but either family can pick up the box
- Box delivery: Sundays at 8:30 am on the WPC Terrace, along the window wall of the Fellowship Hall. Locate your BOX with your name written on it.
- Leave your box from the previous week (and/or the current box) on the Terrace.
- If you won't be there to pick up a full box, make plans for someone else to pick it up. Or, contact the farmer and ask for a double box on the week before or after the week that you'll miss.
- We will send out a list of the vegetables included in the boxes on that Sunday so you can make plans to use the veggies during the week. Our group of subscribers often share recipe ideas! We'll store the recipes in a Google Drive Folder.
