



During most of his three decades in the NC Attorney General's Office, he was a national leader in fighting the rapidly growing elder fraud industry. Those efforts are chronicled in his book Elder Fraud Wars. Since his retirement, David has continued to fight the elder fraud industry, both as a public speaker and as an elder fraud and consumer protection consultant for AARP of North Carolina. He grew up in Chapel Hill, graduated from Davidson College, and obtained his law degree from the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill.

The popular CSA veggie subscription program has returned for the Winter season. The CSA Boxes are delivered by farmer Changhe Zhou from his Huanong Eco-Organic Farm in nearby Hurdle Mills. He grows more than 60 varieties of Asian vegetables year-round in hoop houses. Vegetables are grown pesticide-free and are farmed at a higher standard than grocery store organic.
