





May Aperture: "Writing a Legacy Letter," Led by Jay Sherwin May 15, 7:00-8:15pm, Zoom ONLY

Also called an "ethical will," a Legacy Letter is a written document that allows you to share your life lessons, express your values, and transmit your blessings to future generations. It's shorter than a memoir, typically just a few pages. Writing one is a rewarding experience that creates an enduring gift for family, friends, and other loved ones. This introductory online workshop includes discussion and writing exercises to help you examine your life history, explore your values, and capture important insights. It offers advice, encouragement, and a model structure to help you draft and complete your own Legacy Letter.

Letter to the Congregation from the WPC Personnel Committee

On May 5, the Personnel Committee and Session are excited to present two recommendations to the Congregation:

- To approve the creation of a **Temporary Designated Associate Pastor for Neighborhood Partnerships.**
- To approve the calling of Thankam Rangala to this position, pending Presbytery examination for her ordination in July.

These recommendations represent the culmination of numerous conversations that began in the Personnel Committee last year and were furthered during this budget process.

As Personnel assessed staffing needs, we were mindful of the changing attendance and volunteer patterns which were profoundly disrupted by the pandemic and the impact of these changes on our current staff – they just simply do not have the capacity to add more responsibilities. But we also knew there were vital parts of WPC's mission that needed additional support, specifically (1) building relationships with two key partners on our campus, the Y-Learning program and La Nueva Jerusalem, and (2) congregational care with our older members.

The Personnel Committee discussed these challenges for a few months, exploring different ideas. It was also around that time we had gotten to know Thankam Rangala, first as our seminary intern and then in a very part-time capacity while she was a hospital chaplain through May 2023. She had already built many relationships at WPC and had many gifts from her life and career before she enrolled at Duke Divinity. And we wondered if this might be a strategic opportunity.

In exploring the possibilities, Chris and the Personnel Committee (with the approval of the Session) approached the leaders of New Hope Presbytery's Committee on Ministry (COM) about the possibility of adding an ordained position to focus on mission outreach. The COM invited us to put our ideas in writing. So, in May 2023, the Session did just that. We turned our potential ideas into a proposal to create a part-time associate pastor for neighborhood partnerships. At the time, we did not have approved funds in our budget for this position, so this step was about giving WPC the **option** of this new position. Per Presbyterian polity, a church must receive COM and Presbytery approval to add any ordained position.

Last summer, while Chris was away on sabbatical, we received word that the COM and the entire Presbytery approved the creation of this position. According to our polity, these kinds of "designated" positions must be temporary, lasting between two and four years.

Now that the Presbytery has made this possible, we wanted to know if we could make this happen internally and if Thankam would be willing to serve in this capacity. Through the fall, the Personnel Committee, Ways & Means Commission, and the Session discussed the potential funding of this position and identified one-time funds that could be used to pay for it for three years.

The final – and most important step – was discerning with Thankam Rangala as to whether she would be willing to serve in this capacity. We shared the position description with her and our hopes that she would be willing to work with us more (20 hours/ week) in these specific ways. She agreed. She then needed to work through the Presbytery process as a candidate for ministry and be approved by the Exams and Transfers sub-commission of COM. This was completed in March.

If the congregation is willing to approve this position and to call Thankam to it, then the final step is for her to be examined for ordination on the floor of the next New Hope Presbytery. Providentially, that meeting happens to be here at WPC in July. Then she would work to schedule a service of ordination to be held here at WPC sometime in early August.

We know this is *a lot* of Presbyterian polity, but we wanted to explain this entire process to you. The Session and the Personnel Committee feel fortunate to have such a gifted person in our midst who is willing to serve an important WPC ministry, and the Presbytery has graciously helped make this happen.

We also know you may have questions about this, and the Personnel Committee would like to be available to you. We hope you'll reach out to us if you have any questions. We'll also be in the Courtyard and Parlor after worship over the next several weeks if you have other questions. We want to share with you anything that would be helpful to you to inform your voting at the meeting.
