

WEDNESDAY: Aperture – "Writing a Legacy Letter," Led by Jay Sherwin May 15, 7:00-8:15pm, Zoom ONLY

Also called an "ethical will," a Legacy Letter is a written document that allows you to share your life lessons, express your values, and transmit your blessings to future generations. It's shorter than a memoir, typically just a few pages. Writing one is a rewarding experience that creates an enduring gift for family, friends, and other loved ones. This introductory online workshop includes discussion and writing exercises to help you examine your life history, explore your values, and capture important insights. It offers advice, encouragement, and a model structure to help you draft and complete your own Legacy Letter.

Happy WPC-versary to Sharon!



Important Info: WPC Traffic Flow Changing!

Traffic flow around campus is intended for entering on Sussex Drive (across from Shannon Road) by the Sanctuary and exiting by Calhoon Cabin. Unfortunately, many folks exit at Sussex Drive, which can be dangerous and has been the scene of several accidents lately. In addition, the latest plans for the development across the street now include the addition of a 3-Way stop at this intersection. There will be stop signs on both sides of Old Chapel Hill Road in addition to the existing stop sign at Shannon Road, but it is not currently planned to be marked as a 4-Way stop. This will surely lead to confusion and the potential for accidents for anyone trying to exit from Sussex Drive. WPC's Property Management Team has evaluated current traffic patterns around campus and noted that much of the flow goes against current signage. To address these concerns, we will make the following changes to improve campus safety. Please contact Sharon Morgan (sharon@wpcdurham.org) with any questions.

- Mark Sussex Drive as "entrance only;" add a "NO EXIT" sign to discourage use as an exit.
- Have traffic flow into the Sanctuary parking lot at the first entrance and down Sussex Drive.
- Add a Yield sign at the exit of the Sanctuary parking lot as it merges with the end of Sussex Drive on the ramp up to the back parking lot.
- Change the flow in the back parking lot to flow down both sides.
- Add a stop sign to the back parking lot interior corridor so it's a two-way stop leading to the Preschool parking area.
- Add an additional Stop sign at the exit onto Old Chapel Hill Road.
- Paint arrows on the asphalt throughout campus, as indicated on the map, to encourage flow as marked.
